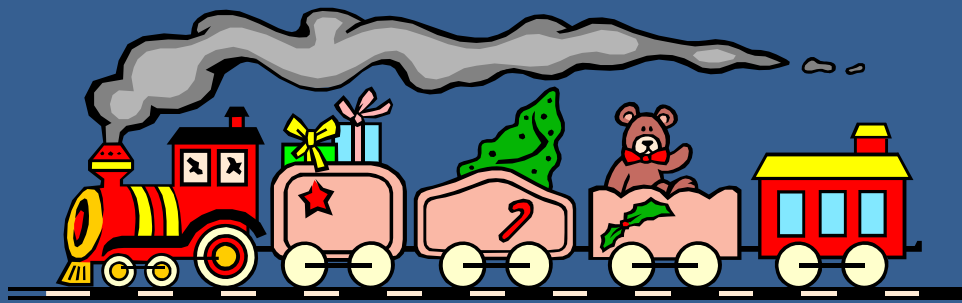

The children need to bring all of their supplies in a bag on the first day of school.

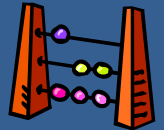
Please refer to the uniform code from the Parent Handbook.
